Dear Friends

Advent is a season of watching and waiting. As we look forward to celebrating the Christmas season we reflect on the promise of Christ that he will come again in glory, bringing the kingdom of heaven to completion on earth.

This year the challenge of keeping Advent as a season of penitence and reflection, amidst the usual clamour of early Christmas celebrations, will be even greater as we spend the first half of the season with the 'noise' of the general election campaign.

We will hear promises made, different views debated. We will learn from our politicians their vision of what will be done to make our country a better, fairer and more just place. We will no doubt listen with some scepticism – and then there will be judgement, of the people through the ballot box.
